






Appomattox FFA, Buckingham FFA, Charlotte FFA, Cumberland FFA, Prince Edward FFA; one group) Only one entry per organization. Only first place will be awarded per group.
3. The theme of the contest is agriculture.
4. The Five County Fair will provide one 5'x5 1/2' round bale of hay per entry. The bales will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis.
5. All items/supplies used to design the hay bale are the responsibility of the exhibitors and need to be securely attached. The hay bale design will be displayed throughout the entire fair.
6. The finished structure size should not exceed 12' long x 12' wide and 10' high.
7. Decorating times will be Sat., September 25, 9 a.m.-6 p.m. All entries must be complete by Saturday September 25 at 6 p.m. Each organization shall provide a sign with the following information: Organization name, title and explanation of design. Signs need to be turned in by Sat., September 25 at 6 p.m. All decorating items should be picked up Sun., October 3, 1 p.m.-5 p.m.
8. Judging will take place Mon., September 27 and will be based on creativity, construction, quality of work and eye appeal.

### **Rules for Miss Five County Fair (Wed. Sept. 29, 2021)**

1. Contestants in the Miss Five County Fair pageant must be single, never married, have no children, and be between ages of 16-22 by Sept. 1, 2021.
2. The V.A.F. reserves the right to conduct a drug testing at their discretion.
3. Contestants will wear long formal evening attire with no gloves, no wrap.

4. The winner, "Miss Five County Fair", will receive a 24" trophy, a sash, a tiara, and a prize of \$100.00, The Five County Fair Association will pay the \$250.00 entry fee to the State Pageant and one-room, two-night hotel lodging for the State Convention in January 2022. #### **Rules for Little Miss Five County Fair (Tues., Sept. 28, 2021)**

1. Little Miss must be 5-6 years old by Sept. 1, 2021.

## Rules Governing Exhibits

1. An exhibitor's stub does not permit entrance to the fair.
2. All Exhibitors Must reside in one of the Five Counties (Appomattox, Buckingham, Cumberland, Charlotte, Prince Edward)
3. All exhibits must be on the fair grounds and entered according to the days and times designated in the divisions.
4. All exhibits remain as the property of the exhibitors and must be **REMOVED** according to the days and times designated in the divisions. Even those exhibits sold must meet requirements of the rules. **READ DIVISION RULES CAREFULLY.**
5. All exhibits must have been completed or grown **WITHIN THE FAIR YEAR** and must represent the work of the exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors are limited to ONE entry in each class.
7. All entry tickets must be filled in with a **BALLPOINT** pen.
8. Entry tickets may be picked up in advance at extension offices and school board offices in each county or call (434) 392-7002.
9. Persons entering articles for exhibit are required to remain with those articles until they are properly recorded, entered, and placed by the Fair Association.
10. All exhibits having been entered in competition must remain on exhibition and may not be withdrawn during **FAIR WEEK.**
11. Prizes will be awarded only if the exhibits are worthy, even though there is only one entry in a class. The degree of the prizes will be determined solely by the judges.
12. No exhibitor shall talk to a judge or call attention to an exhibit preceding or during the judging. If so, and it is brought to the attention of the management, the exhibitor shall forfeit to the **FAIR ASSOCIATION** any prize that may have been warranted.
13. No prize money will be paid without matching claim ticket.
14. To prevent unnecessary contact and to observe **Social Distancing Guidelines**, Please **HAVE** all tickets filled out **Prior** to Entry.

15. Advisors are not allowed to enter an exhibit in divisions of which they are in charge.
16. All club, chapter, or school exhibits shall be erected installed, or displayed only by members or leaders of the group. Agents or teachers may advise, but the work must be done by members of the group only.
17. The Fair Association will do all in its power to prevent injury, loss, or damage to all exhibits, but the **FAIR ASSOCIATION** does not assume liability in case of such injury, loss, or damage.
18. The **FAIR ASSOCIATION** reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit which the General Manager shall for any reason deem unfit or objectionable.
19. The **FAIR ASSOCIATION** will **NOT** be responsible for the return of exhibits.
20. Any exhibits left after Sunday following **FAIR WEEK** will become the property of the **FAIR ASSOCIATION AND MAY BE DISPOSED OF AS SEEN FIT.**
21. If, in the opinion of the Fair Committee, an exhibit willfully violates the rules governing the fair, **ALL PREMIUMS** won, will be forfeited.

## **Youth General Rules and Regulations Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Poultry and Rabbit Divisions**

1. Youth exhibitors are eligible to enter rabbit in open divisions.
2. All exhibitors of Cattle are to be 4H Club, FHA, FFA members or students 20 and under. **An Entry fee of \$5.00 per animal must accompany Entry Form.**
3. All Cattle exhibited must be the property of 4H, FHA, or FFA member or student 20 and under, and must have been fed and cared for by the exhibitor. Any questionable entry will be ruled on by fair manager.
4. Exhibitors are limited to one entry in each class.
5. Each exhibitor will exhibit his own animal in the show ring.
6. All beef cattle must arrive Mon. Sept. 27, by 10AM-4PM. Beef cattle show at 6:30PM. All beef cattle must leave on Thurs. Sept. 30 by 10AM. All Dairy Cattle must arrive on Thurs. Sept. 30 by 2PM. Dairy Cattle show at 4PM. All Dairy Cattle must leave on Sunday Oct. 3, between 1-3PM.
7. Rabbits and Poultry will arrive on Mon., Sept. 27 between Noon and 6PM and be released on Sunday, Oct 3 between 1-3PM. Any animal left after 3PM will become the property of the Five County Fair Association.
8. Fair Associates will not feed, water, or clean up after Beef Cattle or Dairy Cattle. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
9. Liability for all animals exhibited shall rest with the owners of the animals.
10. No animal shall be removed from the fair without the official authorization of the **Fair Manager**.
11. All cattle entered shall be halter broke and exercised, shown and paraded as directed by the advisor.
12. Each class shall be judged in order of their excellence of type, conformation and quality. Judges are requested to give reasons for placings.
13. Only one attendant's pass will be allowed to each exhibitor of Sheep, Goats, Beef and Dairy Cattle.
14. Animals from quarantined herds will not be permitted to enter the show.
15. Animals must be in good health and condition to enter the Fair.

16. If Sufficient number of animals are exhibited, it will be up to the Discretion of the advisor to divide registered and grade animals.
- 17. Entries of all live stock (Beef, Dairy, Rabbits, Poultry, must be submitted to appropriate Advisor. (Use Enclosed Form))**
18. Cattle must be fed and watered at appropriate times by the exhibitor. At no time are feed and water containers to be left in stalls with animal.
19. To encourage exhibitors to display their cattle to the general public in an orderly fashion there will be a herdsman award given for the Youth Beef Cattle and Dairy Cattle. Your display will be judged on cleanliness of tack area, cattle, equipment, and bedding. A panel of judges will be judging the entire time that your cattle will be there. The winners will be announced one hour before the Youth Beef and Dairy Cattle are released.
20. Shorthorns may be shown as Dairy or Beef, **NOT BOTH**.
21. Beef Bulls: Bull entries may be submitted for the youth beef show. All such entries are subject to the approval of the show committee. No bull over 1 year of age will be allowed in the showing without a nose lead. There will be no dairy bulls shown at this show.
22. Beef steers: Registered or crossbred feeder/market steers of breeding may be shown. Minimum feeder calf weight is 300lbs. and no visible horns. Classes will be made up after entries are received. Steers will be assigned classes by weight. A Maximum of three classes of steers may be assigned.
23. Dairy steers: Registered or crossbred feeder/market steers of breeding may be shown. Minimum feeder calf weight is 400lbs. and no visible horns. Classes will be made up after entries are received. Steers will be assigned classes by weight. A Maximum of three classes of steers may be assigned. Dairy steers will be shown in the beef show.
24. Protest of any entry will go to the Protest committee for final decision. Committee members are: Bobby Long, Mary Beth Geesaman and Auburn Estes.
25. If, in the opinion of the Fair Committee, an exhibitor willfully violates the rules governing the fair, all premiums won will be forfeited.
